1. Use a **KEYWORD**. This immediately tells the reader exactly what it is you have to sell.

2. Make your description **CLEAR** and **FACTUAL**. State the year, make, model, color, size, and tell what condition the item is in. Also state the special features.

State the PRICE. 3. Classified Successful

advertisers have learned that the price in an ad helps increase the chances for results.

4. If there's a genuine sense of **URGENCY**, say so. the words, "We're Moving" or "Must Sell Fast" suggests readers that respond immediately.

5. Include your PHONE NUMBER. Classifieds get results fast and often generate immediate sales.

If you cannot be available to answer the phone at all times, be sure to specify special calling times such as "after 6 PM" or "Before 11 AM".

If you need assistance ask one of our friendly AD-VISORS to help you word your ad.

REGULAR WANT ADS: 26¢ per word per week; minimum **\$5.20** per week. Count each initial and each group of figures as one word. *Deadline for Want* Ads is noon Tuesday.



Safety Program Set For Elderly Drivers

cans turning 65 every day and all senior drivers find a better "fit" with their cars for comfort and safety, mobility experts are hosting a safety program designed to help older drivers and their families.

CarFit is a national program developed by AAA, AARP and the American Occupational Therapy Association and is designed to give a quick, yet comprehensive check on how well an older driver and their vehicle work together.

The Texas Department of Transportation (TxDOT) and the Mature Driver Program will be conducting two CarFit educational presentations in both La Grange and Schulenburg on Thursday, March 19.

The La Grange program will be held at the Randolph Recreational Center's General Assembly Room at 9 a.m., and the Schulenburg program at 2 p.m. on the Blinn College Campus, Room 120.

These events are in collaboration with the Texas Extension Education Association, Fayette County; Randolph Recreational Center; Blinn College-Schulenburg Campus; and Texas A&M AgriLife Extension Office of Fayette County.

Later, the next week there will be technician CarFit Checkup events, which will be held at the Schulenburg Blinn Campus on Thursday, March 26, from 9 a.m. to noon and at the Randolph
